Update from Councillor Jenny Gerbasi

Happy New Year! 2015 is poised to be a very exciting year for the Corydon BIZ and the Corydon area. We will see further investments in pedestrian infrastructure, smarter planning and development, and enhanced streetscaping through public art.

Over the last year or so Corydon Avenue sidewalks have been extensively repaired to the tune of a \$500,000 capital investment from the City of Winnipeg. There are still a few more blocks that need renewal. I am pleased to share that this work has been scheduled for this year, pending City Council budgetary approval. Two sidewalk sections in particular were chosen for consideration based on their condition, pedestrian volumes, and bus route ser-



vices: Corydon Avenue on the south side from Nassau Street to Pembina Highway; and Corydon Avenue on the north side from Wentworth Street to Lilac Street.

I am also pleased to report that the long awaited Corydon-Osborne plan was approved by Winnipeg City Council at our December meeting. This means that this wonderful and vibrant area now has guidelines for design, density, pedestrian environment and other factors. The goal is to keep the Corydon area a great place to live, work and play by protecting the existing character while allowing increased density where appropriate. I would like to extend a huge thank you to the many residents, business owners, planners and other stakeholders who have participated in this planning process over these many years. New bike rack has been picked!!

Corydon Avenue BIZ will be getting bike racks this year! Our project has been approved and we expect installation to start in early May. We are very excited about our Bike Racks Project. By popular demand we will install the black loop racks, which will be installed along Corydon Avenue and Lilac Street and the aluminum racks, which are similar to the existing ones at Daly and Hugo Street, and these will be installed at intersec-

tions where there is cement pads to facilitate installation.

As Manitoba's oldest conservation education organization, the Manitoba Forestry Association (MFA) is a leader in the field of forest education. Our mission is to inform and educate all Manitobans about wise management of trees and forests, to ensure they will remain healthy and productive not only for today, but for future generations.

The Manitoba Forestry Association (MFA) was created in the early 1970's, but our roots reach back to the early 1900's. That is when the Canadian Forestry Association (CFA) was established by a group of foresters, business leaders, legislators, and private citizens who felt Canadians needed to understand the important role forests played in our country's environment and economy. It was a ground-breaking move, as the concept of natural resource conservation was barely understood in those days. However, these forward-thinkers forged ahead, kicking off their programming with a focus on forest fire prevention.

As the initiative expanded to encompass education around the entire forest ecosystem, so too did the CFA, and in 1945 the Canadian Forestry Division - Prairie Provinces Division was created. This evolved into the Prairie Provinces Forestry Association and finally, the three prairie province's established separate associations, and the Manitoba Forestry Association was born. This successful legacy has since been nurtured by a dedicated and growing group of volunteers, funders, and MFA members who believe strongly in the importance of forest education. Education of both students and teachers has always been the prime focus of the MFA, from our earliest beginnings more than 90 years ago.

Students...Teachers... Trees... In the simplest of terms, these three words offer just a hint of the multidimensional programming offered by the Manitoba Forestry Association (MFA).

Today more than ever before, the increasing demand on our forests for forest products requires careful management to ensure that forested lands regenerate rapidly, efficiently and that their biodiversity is not only maintained but enhanced. Only by leaving our forests as we find them—or better—will society be able to continue to enjoy and use them for years to come. Through the use of a time-tested toolbox of programs and services, the MFA provides opportunities for people from all walks of life to learn more about the importance of our forests, and to better understand our natural heritage. Whether you are a student or a teacher, a landowner or an interested citizen, an individual or part of a group, one of the programs below is right for you.

MFA's Private Land Resource Planning helps landowners realize the potential of their wooded property and promote stewardship of their land, Envirothon is a hands-on environmental education competition (sometimes called the "Environmental Olympics") for high school students, Heritage Trees encourages the general public to become aware of and interested in special trees in the province.

The Manitoba Forestry Association (MFA) is all about trees. From planting, selling and providing information, the MFA wants to be your number one source when it comes to trees. The MFA strives to educate all Manitobans about the importance of trees while providing information about tree care, maintenance and tree health. The MFA has many years of experience with tree planting, from small to very large projects, working with various organizations and partners to get trees into the ground. So, whether you are planting seedlings or purchasing them for gifts, wedding favours or your cottage or woodlot, the MFA will try to accommodate your needs with a wide variety of tree species, sizes and packaging.

Jane's Walk 2015: Open Call for Walk Leaders



Organize a Jane's Walk in Winnipeg in 2015

Do you have a story to tell? Do you know your neighbourhood like the back of your hand? Or perhaps you're a recent newcomer and can share your experience of learning about a new city? Do you have an idea for a fun, informative, unusual way of looking at cities and neighbourhoods? You could organize a Jane's Walk in Winnipeg this year!

What is Jane's Walk?

Jane's Walk celebrates the ideas and legacy of urbanist Jane Jacobs by getting people out exploring their neighbourhoods and meeting their neighbours. Free walks held on the first weekend of May each year are led by locals who want to create a space for residents to talk about what matters to them in the places they live and work. Since its inception in Toronto in 2007, Jane's Walk has expanded rapidly. Last year, more than 800 walks were held in over 100 cities in 22 countries worldwide. In Winnipeg local citizens have organized walks in neighbourhoods across the city exploring a range of themes including local history, environmental issues, urban design and architecture, accessibility issues, active transportation, public art, social/cultural experiences of the city, and more.

Organizing a Jane's Walk is Easy!

It simply involves planning a route, thinking through the stories, places and people and ideas you want to hear and talk about, and promoting it around your neighbourhood. You can also share the guiding duties with a few other resourceful friends or colleagues. There are only two rules: 1. walks are taken and given for free, and 2. walk leaders promote conversation and encourage participants to share their own knowledge, stories and ideas along the walk.

Plan Your Jane's Walk in 4 Steps

Jane's Walks are proposed, organized and delivered by citizens like you. Anyone is free to lead a Jane's Walk in their community. There is no formal approval or jury process, the only requirement is that your walk aligns with the Jane's Walk principles.

- Step 1: Think about a walk theme and route. Pick a date (May 2 or 3), start time and location.
- Step 2: Complete the Jane's Walk Proposal Outline.
- Step 3: Contact the Jane's Walk Winnipeg organizers to submit your walk proposal. Email Matt Carreau at janeswalkwinnipeg@gmail.com
- Step 4: Wait for confirmation from us and then upload your walk to www.janeswalk.org


